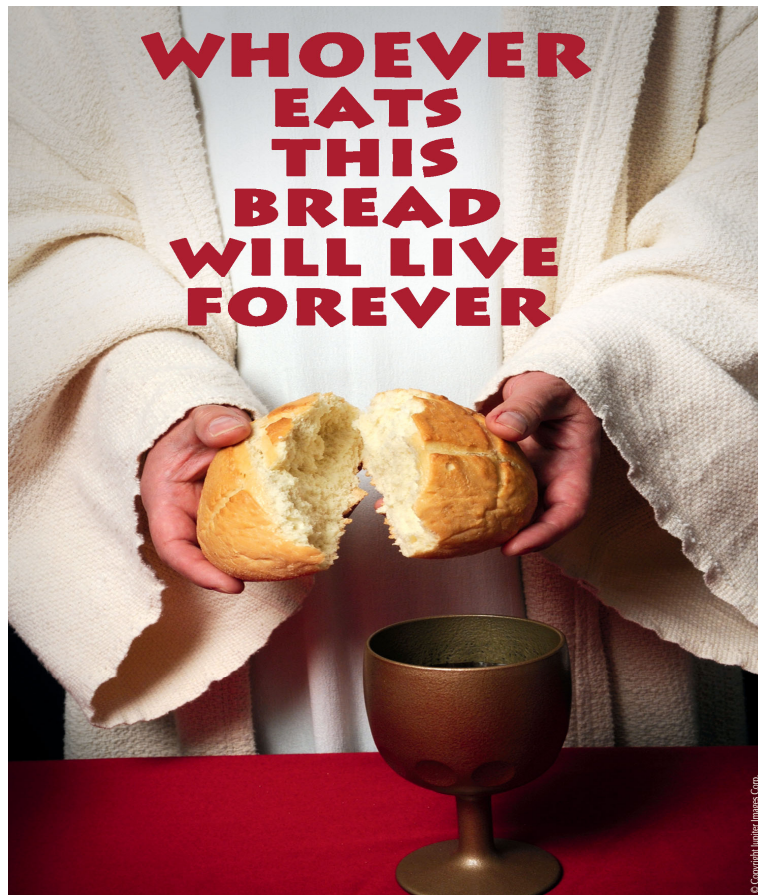

Times may change, but people rarely do. I have in mind the custom of immigrant bashing. Several thousand years ago the Israelites were told, “you shall not oppress or afflict a resident alien, for you were once aliens residing in the land of Egypt.” This passage is part of the Covenant Code, one of the most ancient collections of law in the Hebrew Scriptures.

What this tells us is that fear and suspicion of “the others” and subsequent attempts to subjugate or exclude them are nothing new. We Catholics might well be reminded that we “we’re once aliens residing in the land” — not of Egypt but of America. The English penal laws applied in the colonies. Catholics could not hold office, had to pay double taxes and could not worship publicly. Campaigns to mark Catholics as subversive were waged by the Know Nothings and the Ku Klux Klan, who maintained that Catholicism was antipathetic to American democracy.

Religion, however, was not the only trigger of immigrant bashing. Nativism, based on protecting American values and traditions from being “mongrelized” by immigrants who were considered inferior mentally and culturally, also was prevalent. Thus draconian anti-immigration laws were enacted against the Chinese. Irish, German, Italian and Eastern European immigrants were vilified as sub-human, ne’er-do-wells and drunkards incapable of productive citizenship. They were considered threats to the well-being of the nation. Among the outspoken nativists were Mark Train, Walt Whitman and Samuel F. B. Morse.

Of course, we are an immigrant nation and those whose parents and grandparents were reviled by Nativists are now our legislators, judges, scientists, academics ... and politicians. The ghost of Nativism again prowls our land. The vilifiers and the vilified are different, but the script is the same.

Times may change, but people rarely do.

Los tiempos pueden cambiar pero las personas rara vez lo hacen. Tengo en la mente la costumbre de atacar inmigrantes. Hace varios miles de años les fue dicho a los israelitas, “No maltratarás al extranjero ni lo oprimirás, porque ustedes fueron extranjeros en Egipto” (Ex 22, 20). Este pasaje es parte del Código de la Alianza, una de las colecciones más antiguas de la ley en las Escrituras Hebreas.

Lo que esto nos dice es que el miedo y la sospecha de “los otros” y los posteriores intentos por subyugarlos o excluirlos no son nada nuevo. A nosotros los Católicos también nos podría ser recordado que “alguna vez fuimos extranjeros en la tierra,” no de Egipto, sino de América. Las leyes penales inglesas eran aplicadas en las colonias. Los Católicos no podrían desempeñar cargos, tuvieron que pagar dobles impuestos y no podían realizar actos de culto público. Los movimientos para señalar a Católicos como subversivos fueron provocados por los Know Nothings y el Ku Klux Klan, que argumentaron que el Catolicismo era antagonista a la democracia americana.

Sin embargo, la religión no era el único detonador en los ataques a los inmigrantes. El nativismo, basado en la protección de los valores y tradiciones americanos de una “mestización” por parte de los inmigrantes, quienes eran considerados mental y culturalmente inferiores también prevalecía. Por lo que se promulgaron leyes draconianas anti-migratorias contra chinos, irlandeses, alemanes, italianos y europeos orientales. Estos inmigrantes fueron denigrados como sub-humanos; buenos para nada y borrachos. Fueron considerados una amenaza para el bienestar de la nación. Entre los nativistas abiertamente declarados estaban Mark Twain, Walt Whitman y Samuel F. B. Morse.

Por supuesto que somos una nación de inmigrantes, y aquellos cuyos padres y abuelos fueron aborrecidos por los nativistas son ahora nuestros legisladores, jueces, científicos, académicos... y políticos. El fantasma del nativismo vuelve a merodear por nuestra tierra. Los denigradores y los denigrados son diferentes pero el guion es el mismo.

Los tiempos pueden cambiar, pero las personas rara vez lo hacen.
