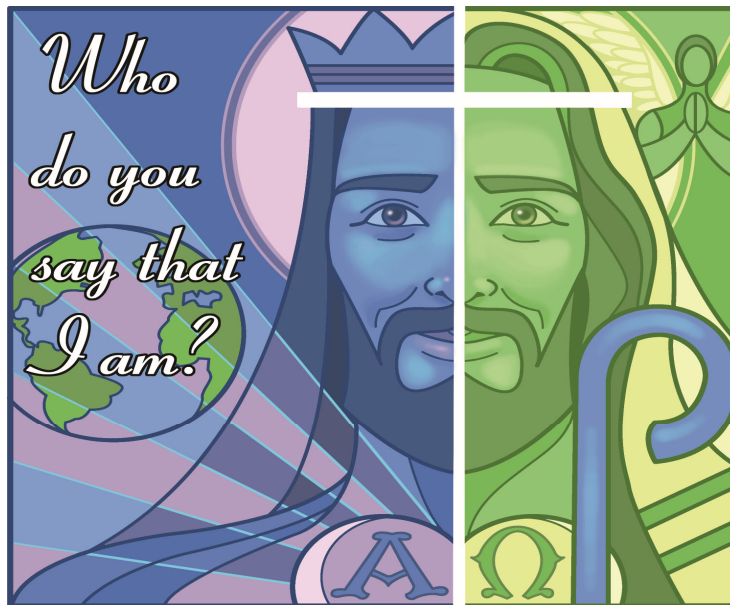

Los jóvenes, hoy - ¿Quiénes son en realidad? by Ron Rolheiser, OMI

Un seminarista a quien conozco fue recientemente, un viernes por la tarde, a una fiesta tenida en un local del campus universitario. El grupo estaba compuesto por un gentío de estudiantes universitarios jóvenes, y cuando él fue presentado como seminarista, como alguien que trataba de llegar a ser sacerdote y que había hecho un voto de celibato, la mención de celibato evocó ciertas risitas en el local, alguna burla y chistes sobre lo mucho de lo que él debe prescindir en la vida. ¡Pobre, ingenuo muchacho! Inicialmente, en este grupo de milenios, sus creencias religiosas y aquello a lo que esto le había llevado en su vida fue estimado como algo entre divertido y lastimoso. Pero, para cuando se acabó la fiesta, varias jóvenes habían venido, llorado sobre sus hombros y expresado su frustración por la incapacidad de sus novios para formalizar definitivamente su relación.

Este incidente podría servir de parábola que describiera a los jóvenes de hoy en nuestro mundo secularizado. Muestran lo que con razón podría ser llamado un carácter bipolar sobre la fe, la iglesia, la familia, el código sexual de valores y otras muchas cosas que les son importantes.

Ellos presentan un cuadro inconsistente: Por una parte, en conjunto, no acuden a la iglesia, al menos con cierta regularidad; no siguen los criterios cristianos sobre la sexualidad; parecen indiferentes e incluso a veces hostiles a muchas apreciadas tradiciones religiosas; y pueden aparecer increíblemente superficiales en su adicción y esclavitud a lo que está tomando rumbo en el mundo del entretenimiento, moda e información tecnológica. Mirado desde una sola perspectiva, nuestros chicos hoy pueden aparecer irreligiosos, moralmente indiferentes y en una pesada dieta del tipo de superficialidad que caracteriza a las "TV realities" y a los juegos de vídeo. Más seriamente todavía, también pueden aparecer miopes, avaros, mimados y excesivamente auto-interesados. No un bonito cuadro, precisamente.

Pero éste no es exactamente el cuadro. Bajo esa apariencia, en la mayoría de los casos, encontraremos a alguno que es muy amable, sincero, delicado, cordial, afable, moral, cálido, generoso y deseoso de todo lo bueno (sin mucha ayuda de una cultura que carece de guía moral clara y está cargada de sobre-elección). La buena noticia es que la mayoría de los jóvenes, a nivel de sus deseos reales, de ninguna manera están peleados con Dios, la fe, la iglesia y la familia. Para la gran mayoría, la juventud hoy es aún muy buena gente y quiere todas las cosas correctas.

Pero, eso no es siempre tan evidente. A veces su apariencia parece engañar su fondo, de modo que lo que de hecho son y lo que de hecho quieren no resulta tan evidente. Vemos lo externo, y vista ahí, nuestra juventud puede aparecer más auto-interesada que generosa, más superficial que profunda, más apática que moralmente sensible, y más moralmente indiferente que llena de fe. También pueden manifestar presunción y auto-suficiencia que sugiere poca vulnerabilidad y ninguna necesidad de guía por parte de alguien más allá de ellos mismos.

De aquí su bipolaridad: Mayormente quieren todas las cosas correctas, pero, demasiado frecuentemente, a causa de una falta de genuina guía y su adicción a la cultura, no están haciendo el tipo de elecciones que les traerán lo que desean más profundamente. La sexualidad es un magnífico ejemplo de esto: Estudios hechos sobre milenios indican que la mayoría de ellos quiere, al cabo del día, ser interiormente monógamos, matrimonio fiel. El problema es que también creen que primero pueden permitirse diez o quince años de promiscuidad sexual, sin tener que aceptar que practicando diez o quince años de infidelidad no sea una buena preparación para la clase de fidelidad necesaria para sustentar un matrimonio y una familia. En esto, como en muchas otras cosas, son atrapados entre su código cultural de valores y sus frágiles seguridades propias. La cultura pregona una cierta ética, la liberación de las timideces del pasado, acabada con una presunción que empequeñece cualquier cosa que cuestiona. Pero mucho de esa presunción es de hecho silbar en la oscuridad. En el fondo, nuestros jóvenes son bastante inseguros y, felizmente, esto los mantiene vulnerables y simpáticos.

Tal vez Louis Dupré, filósofo retirado que enseñó durante muchos años en Yale, lo capta de la mejor manera cuando dice que los jóvenes de hoy no son malos, simplemente, no están acabados. Eso es una simple mirada que capta mucho. Uno puede ser maravilloso y muy simpático, pero aún inmaduro. Además, si eres bastante joven, eso incluso puedes ser atractivo, la verdadera definición de agradable. Lo contrario es también, muchas veces, verdadero: Algunos de nosotros, adultos, sufrimos de nuestra propia bipolaridad: Somos maduros, pero lejos de ser maravillosos y simpáticos. Esto tiende a algunos dobles extraños y paradójicos.

Así, ¿quién es el actual joven de hoy? ¿Es la persona que se envuelve en su propio mundo, obsesiva de la apariencia física, adicta a los medios sociales, viviendo fuera del matrimonio con su pareja, presumiendo de su propia visión moral y religiosa no-tradicional? Eso -creo yo- es la apariencia superficial. El actual joven de hoy es cálido, de buen corazón, generoso y confiado, que espera conscientemente el amor y la afirmación, y que espera inconscientemente el abrazo de Dios.

A seminarian I know recently went to a party on a Friday evening at a local university campus. The group was a crowd of young, college students and when he was introduced as a seminarian, as someone who was trying to become a priest and who had taken a vow of celibacy, the mention of celibacy evoked some giggles in the room, some banter, and a number of jokes about how much he must be missing out on in life. Poor, naïve fellow! Initially, within this group of millennials, his religious beliefs and what this had led to in his life was regarded as something between amusing and pitiful. But, before the evening was out, several young women had come, cried on his shoulder, and shared about their frustration with their boyfriends' inability to commit fully to their relationship.

This incident might serve as a parable describing today's young people in our secularized world. They exhibit what might aptly be called a bi-polar character about faith, church, family, sexual ethos, and many other things that are important to them.

They present an inconsistent picture: On the one hand, by and large, they are not going to church, at least with any regularity; they are not following the Christian ethos on sexuality; they seem indifferent to and even sometimes hostile to many cherished religious traditions; and they can appear unbelievably shallow in their addiction and enslavement to what's trending in the world of entertainment, fashion, and information technology. Looked at from one perspective, our kids today can appear irreligious, morally blasé, and on a heavy diet of the kind of superficiality that characterizes reality television and video games. More seriously still, they can also appear myopic, greedy, pampered, and excessively self-interested. Not a pretty picture.

But this isn't exactly the picture. Beneath that surface, in most cases, you will find someone who is very likeable, sincere, soft, good-hearted, gracious, moral, warm, generous, and searching for all the right things (without much help from a culture that lacks clear moral guidance and is fraught with over-choice). The good news is that most young people, at the level of their real desires, are not at odds at all with God, faith, church, and family. For the most part, youth today are still very good people and want all the right things.

But, that isn't always so evident. Sometimes their surface seems to trump their depth so that who they really are and what they really want is not so evident. We see the surface and, seen there, our youth can appear more self-interested than generous, more shallow than deep, more blasé than morally sensitive, and more religiously indifferent than faith-filled. They can also manifest a smugness and self-sufficiency that suggests little vulnerability and no need for guidance from anyone beyond themselves.

Hence their bi-polarity: Mostly they want all the right things, but, too often, because of a lack of genuine guidance and their addiction to the culture, they aren't making the kinds of choices that will bring them what they more-deeply desire. Sexuality is a prime example here: Studies done on millennials indicate that most of them want, at the end of the day, to be inside a monogamous, faithful marriage. The problem is that they also believe that they can first allow themselves ten to fifteen years of sexual promiscuity, without having to accept that practicing ten to fifteen years of infidelity is not a good preparation for the kind of fidelity needed to sustain marriage and family. In this, as in many other things, they are caught between their cultural ethos and their own fragile securities. The culture trumpets a certain ethos, liberation from the timidities of the past, complete with a smugness that belittles whatever questions it. But much of that smugness is actually whistling in the dark. Deep down, our youth are pretty insecure and, happily, this keeps them vulnerable and likeable.

Maybe Louis Dupre, the retired philosopher who taught for some many years at Yale, captures it best when he says that today's young people are not bad, they're just not finished. That's a simple insight that captures a lot. Someone can be wonderful and very likeable, but still immature. Moreover, if you're young enough, that can even be attractive, the very definition of cool. The reverse is also, often times, true: More than a few of us, adults, suffer from our own bi-polarity: we are mature, but far from wonderful and likeable. This makes for some strange, paradoxical binaries.

So who is the actual young person of today? Is it the person who is wrapped up in his or her own world, obsessive about physical appearance, addicted to social media, living outside marriage with his or her partner, smug in his or her own non-traditional moral and religious views? That, I believe, is the surface appearance. The actual young person of today is warm, good-hearted, generous, and waiting, waiting consciously for love and affirmation, and waiting unconsciously for God's embrace.
