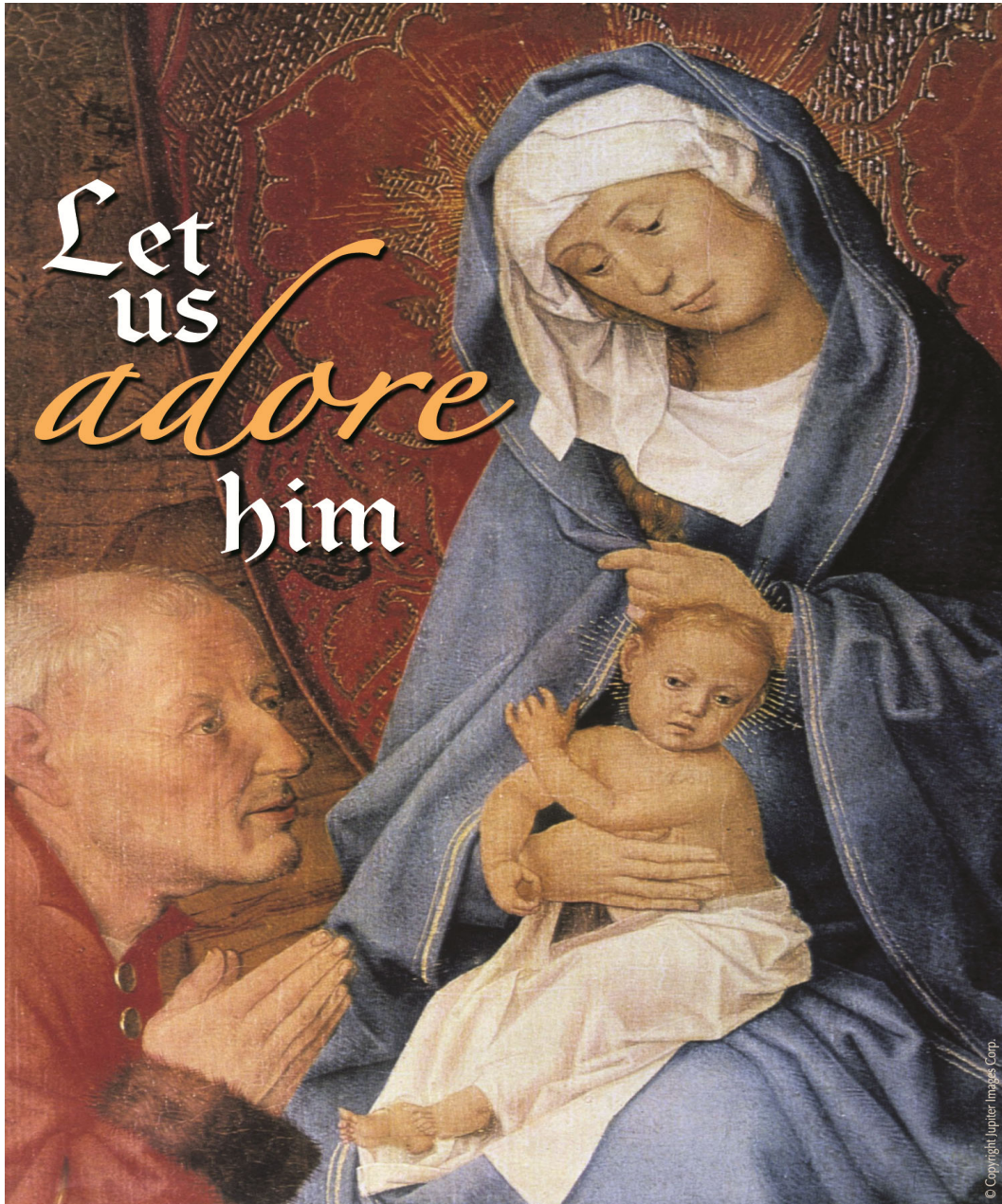

On Saturday, **January 17, 2015**, Dallas will mark the 42nd anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, legalizing abortion in America and leading to the death of over 55 million unborn children.

Join **Bishop Kevin Farrell** and thousands of people of faith to pray for an end to the scourge of abortion on our city and country, to witness publicly, and rally and march for a Culture of Life.

The **2015 Roe Memorial Mass** will be celebrated by Bishop Farrell at 1:00 p.m. at the **convention center in Dallas** (seating 9,000!), preceded by a **Youth Rally featuring World Youth Day Musician Curtis Stephan** at 12:30 p.m. (doors open at 11:30 a.m.).
