In the Peace Prayer of St. Francis the various couplets following our request to be made God's instrument as we discussed in our last blog, are a litany of those elements necessary for peace; love, pardon, faith, hope, light and joy—"but the greatest of these is love." (1 Cor. 13:13) Our verse this week is on love because it is the cornerstone of peace. It is also the antithesis of hatred to which it is closely related as is true of antithetical terms, which are defined by each other. For example, darkness is the absence of light.

Poetess Etlá Wheeler Wilcox penned the line, "Love lights more fires than hate extinguishes." Hate destroys, love gives life. Hatred and love cannot co-exist. Jesus commands us that we are to "love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12). One who loves unconditionally, as God loves us, cannot hate.

Hatred has many faces. Nobel laureate and Holocaust survivor Elie Weisel professes that "the opposite of love is not hate; it's indifference," which he characterizes as, "the epitome of evil." Indeed, Pope Francis has been an outspoken critic of the "globalization of indifference," which has replaced love and mercy with "an economic system that has removed the person from the centre and replaced him with the god of money; an economic system that excludes, and creates the throwaway culture in which we live."

We sow love by our witness, acts of kindness, compassion, mercy, consideration shown to others. Love is contagious. The Holy Father observed that "Goodness always tends to spread. Every authentic experience of truth and goodness seeks by its very nature to grow within us, and any person who has experienced a profound liberation becomes more sensitive to the needs of others. As it expands, goodness takes root and develops. If we wish to lead a dignified and fulfilling life, we have to reach out to others and seek their good" (EG 9). Just as "the love of Christ urges us on" (2 Cor 5:14), our acts of love impel others, for God is love and those who abide in love abide in God, and God in them. (1 John 4:16)

Sembrando el amor de Dios

En la Oración por la Paz de San Francisco, las estrofas que le siguen a nuestra petición a Dios para que nos haga sus instrumentos, como lo comentamos en nuestro último blog, son una letanía de los elementos necesarios para la paz; amor, perdón, fe, esperanza, luz y alegría—"pero la más grande de todas es el amor" (1Cor 13,13).

Nuestra frase de esta semana es acerca del amor porque el amor es la piedra angular de la paz. Asimismo, el amor es la antítesis del odio al cual está estrechamente vinculado, ya que términos contrarios se definen entre sí, por ejemplo la oscuridad es definida como ausencia de luz.

La poetisa Etlá Wheeler Wilcox escribió: "el amor enciende más incendios de los que apaga el odio." El odio destruye... el amor da vida. El odio y el amor no pueden coexistir. Jesús nos manda a amarnos los unos a los otros, como él nos ha amado (Jn 15,12). Quien ama incondicionalmente, como Dios nos ama, no puede odiar.

El odio tiene muchas caras. Elie Weisel, laureado del Premio Nobel y sobreviviente del Holocausto, expresa, "lo opuesto al amor no es el odio, es la indiferencia." Weisel caracteriza la indiferencia como "la personificación del mal." De hecho, el Papa Francisco ha sido un crítico abierto de la "globalización de la indiferencia," que ha sustituido el amor y la misericordia con "un sistema económico que ha quitado a la persona del centro y la ha reemplazado con el dios del dinero; un sistema económico que excluye y crea la cultura desechable en la que vivimos."

A través de nuestro testimonio sembramos amor, actos de bondad, compasión, misericordia y consideración por el prójimo. El amor es contagioso. El Santo Padre señaló que, "Dios siempre tiende a extenderse. Cada experiencia auténtica de verdad y bondad busca por su propia naturaleza crecer dentro de nosotros, y cualquier persona que ha experimentado una profunda liberación se hace más sensible a las necesidades de los demás. Al expandirse, la bondad echa raíces y se desarrolla. Si queremos llevar una vida digna y plena, debemos llegar hasta los demás y buscar su bien" (EG 9). Así como, "el amor de Cristo nos apremia" (2 Cor 5,14) nuestros actos de amor impulsan a otros porque Dios es amor y quienes permanecen en el amor permanecen en Dios y Dios en ellos (1 Jn 4,16).

**Do not cast me aside in my old age;
as my strength fails, do not forsake me.**

Psalm 71:9

As the percentage of the population over 65 increases, attitudes toward and care of the elderly becomes a major concern for families and our society as a whole. Addressing this issue on March 5, in an audience with members of the Pontifical Academy for Life, the Holy Father emphasized that, “The biblical commandment to honor our parents reminds us in a broader sense of our duty to honor all elderly people.”

We cannot allow ourselves to become indifferent to suffering, “the human person always remains precious, even when elderly or afflicted by illness,” the Pope continued, “The elderly need, first and foremost, the care of their families – whose affection cannot be substituted even by the most efficient structures or by the most competent and charitable healthcare workers.”

Census data indicates a decline in the nursing home population, attributable to better health among the elderly but also to more being cared for by their families in their homes. That is good news. Regardless of the quality of care available, there is a sense of abandonment attached to moving to a nursing home.

“Abandonment,” Pope Francis stated, “is the most serious ‘malady’ to afflict the elderly, and also the greatest injustice they can suffer; those who have helped us to grow should not be abandoned when they need our help, our love.”

There are circumstances which make it impossible to care for a parent or elderly person at home and an assisted living facility must be used. In that event every effort must be made to insure proper and loving care is provided and frequent visits and phone calls made to maintain connections and prevent the feeling of abandonment.

“When life becomes very fragile and the end of earthly life comes close, we feel the responsibility to look after and accompany the person in the best way possible,” the Pope continued. This would involve both spiritual and medical care. Spiritually, pastoral care and the Sacrament of the Sick should be made available, and medically, effective palliative care to relieve suffering should be used.

St. Paul reminds us “Whoever does not provide for relatives and especially family members has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.” (1 Timothy 5:8)
