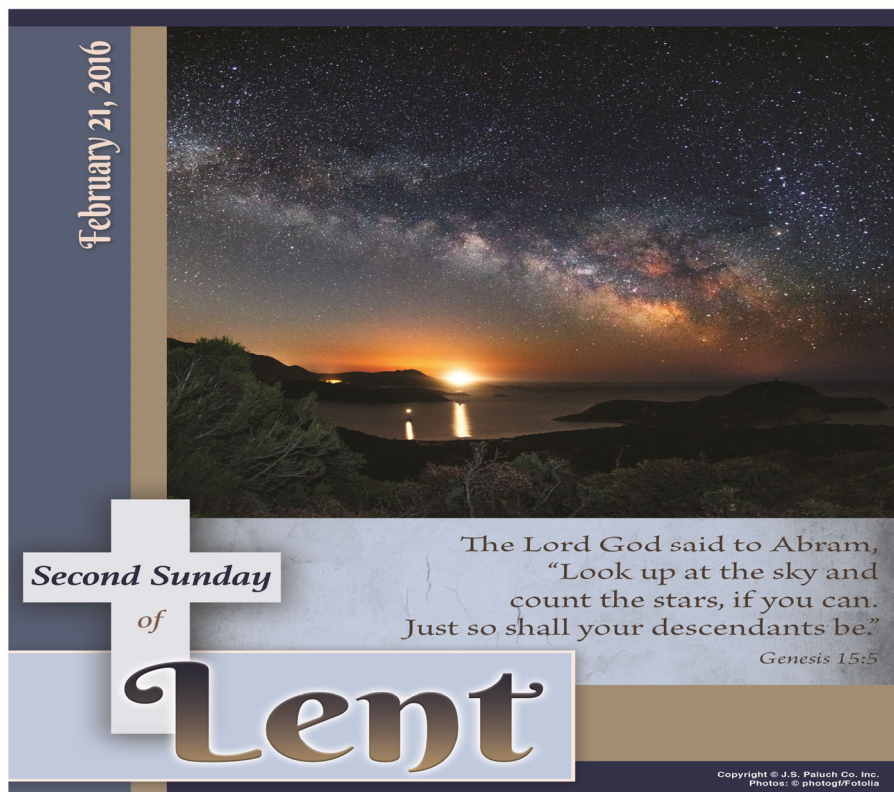

Meeting of Pope Francis and Russian Orthodox Patriarch Kirill

Unprecedented is the only word to describe the meeting in Havana on Friday, Feb. 12, between the primates of the Catholic and Russian Orthodox churches. Pope Francis will stop over at Havana en route to Mexico City. Russian Orthodox Patriarch Kirill will be in the second day of a planned visit to three Latin American nations. St. John Paul II first expressed hope for such a meeting shortly after the fall of the Soviet Union and similar hopes have been expressed by both Pope Emeritus Benedict and Pope Francis.

The two-hour conversation at the Havana airport will be the first time that primates of the two churches have met. Officials at the Moscow Patriarchate reported that the persecution of Christians would be the central theme of the discussion. Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox and Eastern Catholics have borne the brunt of Christian persecution and oppression in the Middle East. The meeting will conclude with the signing of a joint declaration.

Russian Orthodox Metropolitan Hilarion of Volokolamsk, director of foreign relations for the Moscow Patriarchate, told reporters, "The statement will not be of a theological nature since that dialogue takes place in the framework of the International Commission for Dialogue between the Catholic Church and all the Orthodox Churches." Instead, he says, it will be a declaration on different aspects of collaboration and testimony that the Russian Orthodox Church and the Catholic Church can give in our world today. These may include the problem of persecuted Christians in the Middle East, secularization, the protection of life, marriage, the family and other issues of shared concern.

Dominican Father Hyacinthe Destivelle, who is in charge of relations with the Slavic Orthodox Churches at the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity, stated, "The role of the meeting is within the framework of the dialogue of charity since Pope Francis has often said he is willing to promote a culture of encounter, especially in this Jubilee Year of Mercy – adding, there will be no unity without mercy."

Meeting of the primates in Havana will mark an important stage in relations between the two churches, which have experienced tension due to the Russian Orthodox claims of Catholic proselytism and the matter of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, which left Orthodoxy in 1595 and restored communion with Rome. Patriarch Kirill brought extensive ecumenical experience to the Russian Patriarchy and has long been seen as more open to closer relations with Rome and other Christian churches.

Separation of Rome from the Orthodox patriarchate in the East occurred in 1054, in the Great Schism. Several attempts at reconciliation failed. Prince Vladimir I (St. Vladimir) of Kiev, whose grandmother had been baptized in Constantinople, was baptized in the Byzantine rite in 988 and led Russia into Eastern Christianity. The Russian Orthodox Church became autocephalous (independent) in 1589.

Father Destivelle also noted that "Beyond an encounter between two Christian leaders, the February meeting also signals a significant and historic move toward wider Christian unity between the long-separated Eastern and Western churches." The warming of relations began with St. John XXIII inviting Orthodox observers to Vatican II. They were significantly improved by the meeting of Blessed Pope Paul VI with Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras in Jerusalem in 1964—the first such meeting since 1438. About 20 such encounters have since occurred, culminating in a close friendship between Pope Francis and Patriarch Bartholomew, the current ecumenical patriarch.

This is also an historic time for Orthodoxy because in June the first synod meeting of the various Orthodox churches in more 1,000 years will take place in Crete.

Please join me in praying for God's blessing on the primates' meeting in Havana and on the continuing steps toward unity.

An invitation to God's Mercy this Lent / Experimentemos la Misericordia de Dios esta Cuaresma

As you receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, the minister asks you to turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel. Those words are an invitation to God's mercy.

In his Lenten message to the Church, Our Holy Father Pope Francis asks that the Season of Lent in 2016 "be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy." With the Pope's words in mind, I will devote my blogs for each week of Lent and the Holy Week Triduum to the many aspects of God's mercy.

When he opened the Holy Door at the Vatican on December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis reminded us of "How much wrong we do to God and his grace when we speak of sins being punished by his judgment before we speak of them being forgiven by his mercy — we have to put mercy before judgment."

Our Holy Father reminds us in his message that, "The mystery of divine mercy is revealed in the history of the covenant between God and his people Israel. God shows himself ever rich in mercy, every ready to treat his people with deep tenderness and

compassion, especially at those moments when infidelity ruptures the bond of the covenant, which then needs to be ratified more firmly in justice and truth. Here is a true love story, in which God plays the role of the betrayed father and husband, while Israel plays the unfaithful child and bride. These domestic images— as in the case of Hosea (Cf Hos 1-2) — shows to what extent God wishes to bind himself to his people ... in Christ the Father pours forth his boundless mercy even to making him "mercy incarnate" (Misericordiae Vultus 8).

Forgiveness then is not only something to be received but something to be offered. It should be part of our nature. Mercy should be proactive, not only given reluctantly when it is asked for but offered freely to those who have offended us and never withheld as punishment or retaliation. Reconciliation is sharing God's mercy.

For some of us it is easier to forgive others than to forgive ourselves. Somehow we feel that our offenses are beyond forgiveness. Pope Francis points out that such is not the case, reminding us that "in Jesus crucified, God shows his desire to draw near to sinners, however far they may have strayed from him."

The sacrament of reconciliation is a personal and intimate experience of God's mercy. Our priests, as missionaries of mercy, have been given the privilege to forgive the most serious of sins, even those reserved to the Holy See. They will be, in the words of Pope Francis, "living signs of the Father's readiness to welcome those in search of his pardon."

"We implore you, on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." (2 Cor 5:20)

Cuando recibas las cenizas el Miércoles de Ceniza, el ministro te pedirá que te arrepientas de tus pecados y creas en el Evangelio. Estas palabras son una invitación a aceptar la misericordia de Dios.

En su Mensaje de Cuaresma a la Iglesia, Nuestro Santo Padre Francisco pide que el Tiempo de Cuaresma en el año 2016 "sea vivido con mayor intensidad, como momento fuerte para celebrar y experimentar la misericordia de Dios". Con las palabras del Papa en mente, dedicaré blogs semanales durante la Cuaresma y el Triduo Pascual a los numerosos aspectos de la misericordia de Dios.

Al abrir la Puerta Santa en el Vaticano, el 8 de diciembre, durante la Fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción, el Papa Francisco nos recordó "cuánto se ofende a Dios y a su gracia al afirmarse sobre todo que los pecados son castigados por su juicio, en vez de destacar que son perdonados por su misericordia — debemos anteponer la misericordia al juicio".

Nuestro Santo Padre nos recuerda en su mensaje que, " El misterio de la misericordia divina se revela a lo largo de la historia de la alianza entre Dios y su pueblo Israel. Dios, en efecto, se muestra siempre rico en misericordia, dispuesto a derramar en su pueblo, en cada circunstancia, una ternura y una compasión visceral, especialmente en los momentos más dramáticos, cuando la

infidelidad rompe el vínculo del Pacto y es preciso ratificar la alianza de modo más estable en la justicia y la verdad. Aquí estamos frente a un auténtico drama de amor, en el cual Dios desempeña el papel de padre y de marido traicionado, mientras que Israel el de hijo/hija y el de esposa infiel. Son justamente las imágenes familiares — como en el caso de Oseas (Os 1-2) — las que expresan hasta qué punto Dios desea unirse a su pueblo... en Cristo, Dios derrama su ilimitada misericordia hasta tal punto que hace de Él la «Misericordia encarnada» (Misericordiae Vultus 8).

El perdón no es sólo algo que recibimos sino algo que debemos ofrecer y que debería ser parte de nuestra naturaleza. La misericordia debería ser proactiva, no sólo dada a regañadientes cuando nos es solicitada sino ser ofrecida libremente a quienes nos han ofendido y nunca retenerla como castigo o represalia. La reconciliación es compartir la misericordia de Dios.

A algunos de nosotros nos resulta más sencillo perdonar a los demás que perdonarnos a nosotros mismos. De alguna manera sentimos que nuestras ofensas trascienden el perdón. El Papa Francisco señala que no es así, y nos recuerda que "en Jesús crucificado, Dios quiere llegar hasta el pecador incluso en su lejanía más extrema, justamente allí donde se perdió y se alejó de Él".

El Sacramento de la Reconciliación es una experiencia personal e íntima de la misericordia de Dios. A nuestros sacerdotes, como misioneros de la misericordia, les ha sido otorgado el privilegio de perdonar los pecados más graves, incluso aquellos cuyo perdón ha sido reservado a la Santa Sede. Ellos serán, en las palabras del Papa Francisco, "un signo concreto de la cercanía y el perdón de Dios".

"Les suplicamos en nombre de Cristo: Déjense reconciliar con Dios". (2Cor 5,20)
